

## **Glass Recycling Contest 101**

How to jumpstart your school's participation in the Glass Recycling Contest hosted by Georgia Public Service Commissioners <u>Tim Echols</u> and <u>Jason Shaw</u> & sponsored by <u>ARGLASS</u> and <u>Georgia Natural Gas</u>.

- 1. Come up with the process that your school will use to collect and store your glass.
- 2. Designate bins for each of three colors: **Clear, Green, Brown**. Mixing colors while melting glass can compromise the structure of the finished product, thus color sorting is important.
- 3. Some schools pass out bags to participants so they can safely bring glass into the campus. Bags with handles, like paper bags from Trader Joes, work well.
- 4. Clear the plan with your principal's office.
- 5. Handle glass with work gloves once it arrives since some glass could be broken.
- 6. Have your participants ensure glass is clean and dry, and caps are removed.
- 7. If glass comes in dirty, please clean it at the school before we pick it up. If glass is dirty, it could result in a deduction in your school score.
- 8. Do not intentionally break glass.
